Who is affected by arthritis?

Prevalence of Common Forms of Arthritis


Osteoarthritis

- 32.5 million: Adults living with osteoarthritis, making it the most common cause of joint pain (caused by loss of protective cartilage at the ends of bones). This includes:
 - 25.3 million non-Hispanic whites, but non-Hispanic Black and Hispanic populations have a higher share of adults aged 45 and older reporting OA
 - 14.8 million between the ages of 45-64;13.8 million aged 65 or older
 - 78% female (compared to 51% of the adult population who are female) and 43% of adults 65 and older (vs. 18% of that population who are female)
 - Females hospitalized with OA outnumber males
 2:1

Fybromyalgia

- 4-10 million: Adults suffering from fibromyalgia (chronic pain condition affecting between 2%-5% of adult population)
 - Most prevalent in females (who are up to 90% of incident cases)

Prevalence of Arthritis and Other Rheumatic Conditions



Spondyloarthropathies

 2.4 million: Persons affected by spondyloarthropathies, including ulcerative colitis or Crohn's disease

Rheumatoid Arthritis (RA)

- 1.3-1.5 million: Persons with debilitating RA, especially in the hands
 - Prevalence by sex: affects more women (0.29%-0.31% of males, 0.73%-0.78% of females)
 - ➤ Hospitalizations: females outnumber males 3:1
 - Prevalence increases with age

Lupus

- 320,000: Persons affected by lupus
 - Incidence higher among women (as high as 12:1); onset during childbearing years

Juvenile Arthritis

 294,000: Children diagnosed with some form of juvenile arthritis (JA), 40%-45% of whom will still have arthritis after 10 years

Gout

- 6.1 million: Persons with gout
 - Prevalence rising due to obesity and hypertension
 - Prevalence higher in males (5.9%) than females (2.0%) at a ratio of 3-4:1
